The fall 2023 Alpha course experienced the same outcome. Michel Proulx hosted a group of very engaged group of people, who like the winter Alpha, were made up of new attendees to Hillside. Paco and Sandro Romera graciously volunteered as Helpers and their presence provided great support to Michel. As the course was coming to completion the sense was that this group, who had connected relationally with Jesus and with each other, wanted to continue to meet weekly. This could not have happened without Paco and Sandra stepping up to lead this newly formed Life Group.

YOUTH MINISTRY


A big highlight of our year in youth ministry is always our spring retreat. This last May, we spent a weekend away at Camp Kawkawa with two of our neighbouring churches. The sun shone warm on us and so many laughs were had. Jaden Neufeld, a good friend of ours, helped us to think seriously about Jesus's love for each of us and how that gets played out in intentional relationships with other followers of Jesus.

Youth ministry is always changing and a change this year has been in how we have organized our Friday nights. Our group has grown and so this fall we began to experiment creating separate spaces for the middle school and high school groups. While we all get together at different points in the evening, this has created more opportunity for peer-friendships to develop and for discussions that are more focused. This has meant a bigger emphasis on small groups and so we've felt the need of more small group leaders to help care for these students as they follow Jesus.

A real highlight for me in caring for this ministry has been the continued eagerness from our church to sing. God has called us to praise him and I think he meets us as we do. I am so profoundly grateful—week in and week out—to be part of a church that loves to bring praise to Jesus.

LOCAL OUTREACH

Expanding Community Need: The needs of vulnerable people in our community continue to grow, and so we continue to press into our partnerships with **Share Family and Community Services, Centennial Secondary School, and Pregnancy Concerns.** Each of these groups do amazing work in serving the 'least of these' and we are honoured to serve alongside them. The Christmas Banquet for food bank clients was again such a beautiful expression of compassion and hospitality.

English Language Learning Program: In responding to the growing numbers of new Canadians in our church family and community, we launched a new ESL language learning program on Fridays. This new ministry is already expanding and helping a significant number of new Canadians.

Refugee Sponsorship. We raised close to \$30,000 in 2023 towards the sponsorship of a long-time displaced refugee family from Burundi. We continue to wait and pray for God to open doors and provide for their successful application and integration into Canada.


